## Neighborhood Watch Information

This summer, the residents of Stonewater were invited to attend a Community Watch meeting with police officers from the Town of Cary. We learned how we can help to keep Stonewater a safe place for our families. As residents and neighbors, we are the "eyes and ears" of the police department. This means that if you see suspicious behavior, please report it to the Town of Cary Police, no matter how minor.

We are asking all residents to please turn on your porch/outdoor light at night (and keep it on through the night until morning) to help deter burglars from entering our neighborhood. One easy (and economical) way to do this is to install a timer as well as energy efficient light bulbs, such as compact fluorescents.

We were given some great advice about keeping our homes and neighborhood safe:

*Make your home look occupied* - Leave some lights and a radio on when you're out.

Lock your doors - Always lock your doors when you are out and even when at home.

*Use deadbolt locks* - A deadbolt is a good deterrent to burglars.

*Don't hide a key outside* - Burglars know all the secret hiding places.

*Drill and pin your windows* - Window locks can be jimmied; pins cannot.

*Brace sliding glass doors* - If a door is braced, the only way a burglar can get through it is to break it.

*Install good exterior lighting* - Motion sensor lights and other good lights don't let a burglar hide in the dark.

Keep bushes and shrubs trimmed - If bushes are too high, someone hiding near your windows and doors cannot be seen.

*Stop mail and paper deliveries* - If you go on vacation, stop deliveries or have a neighbor collect **your mail and papers**.

*Get a dog* - Even a small dog may be a deterrent to a burglar.

Install an alarm system - Houses with alarms are avoided by burglars.

We can all work together to make Stonewater the safest neighborhood possible. Thanks for your help! \*

#### **Shrimp and Andouille** Sausage with Asiago Grits

**Cook's Corner** 

Prep: 25 min., Cook: 23 min. Yield: Makes 6 servings

#### Ingredients

- \* 11/2 pounds unpeeled, medium-size raw shrimp
- tablespoon butter
- 1/2 pound andouille sausage, diced
- 3/4 cup whipping cream
- 1/3 cup chicken broth
- 1/3 cup dry white wine1/2 cup freshly grated Asiago or Parmesan cheese
- 1/4 teaspoon ground white pepper \*

Peel shrimp; devein, if desired.

Melt butter in a large skillet over medium-high heat; add sausage, and cook, stirring constantly, 5 minutes or until lightly browned. Add shrimp, and cook, stirring constantly, 3 to 5 minutes or just until shrimp turn pink. Remove shrimp and sausage mixture from skillet.

Add cream, broth, and wine to skillet; cook over medium heat, stirring constantly, 5 minutes or until slightly thickened. Stir in cheese and pepper; cook, stirring constantly, 6 to 8 minutes or until cheese is melted. Stir in shrimp and sausage mixture. Serve over Asiago Grits. Garnish, if desired.

#### Asiago Grits

- \*\* 2 (14-oz.) cans chicken broth
- \* 3/4 cup uncooked quick-cooking grits
- ◆ 1/2 (8-oz.) container chive-and-onion cream cheese
- \*\* 1/2 cup freshly grated Asiago or Parmesan cheese
- 1/4 teaspoon ground white pepper  $\div$

Bring chicken broth to a boil in a medium saucepan over medium-high heat; gradually whisk in grits. Cover, reduce heat to medium-low, and simmer, stirring occasionally, 12 to 15 minutes or until thickened. Add cheeses and pepper, stirring until melted.

Garnish: chopped fresh chives

## **Gardener's Nook**



Now is the time to start planning your spring garden. Building a raised bed garden is the perfect way to start. A raised bed garden gives you control over the quality of the soil, is easily accessible and affordable! Follow these steps to build your raised bed:

- Design the shape and measure the space 1. available
- Decide what to build the garden with (cedar, 2. bricks, rocks or paver blocks as we did for our garden)
- 3. Dig up sod/grass in the shape of your garden. Turn the soil underneath down 6".
- 4. Build your garden. My husband and I built ours against the side of our fence. We used two layers of 12" blocks.
- 5. Fill with soil (we purchased a truck load from "For Garden's Sake" on Hwy751). Turn in compost or compost manure. If desired you can also mix in an organic fertilizer.
- 6. Get your hands dirty by planting your garden!

My family will be planting beets and carrots in March. Our summer crop last year consisted of basil, cilantro, cucumbers, snow peas, bib lettuce, tomatoes and Serrano chilies! Share your gardening adventures on the Google Group! \*
